After completing his service, he resumed working at NASA where he received many awards for his outstanding contributions to various projects which benefited the space program.

He loved his work, but even more, he loved his co-workers who became his "Space Center family" over the 42 years he was employed there. A vigil and a recitation of the Holy Rosary will begin at 6:00 p.m., Wednesday, August 2, 2017.
