Frank was on the Fort Bend WCID #2 water board from 1979-2020, serving many roles including Secretary, Vice President, Director, and President. He was also a member of the Stafford Historical Society and Stafford Education Foundation. The Stafford Education Foundation recently name a scholarship in his honor for 2020. Frank supported the Stafford Athletic Department at the Stafford School and loved going to the football games. He was also an advocate for BAPS Shri Swaminarayan Mandir of Houston (which is located in Stafford) and was involved with TIRZ of Missouri City.

Frank also believed in traditions. He liked to dance and eat Italian food and sweets. He loved to get together for the holidays. He would always call his friends and family just to say hello and make sure everyone was ok. He was loved by many and will be missed.
