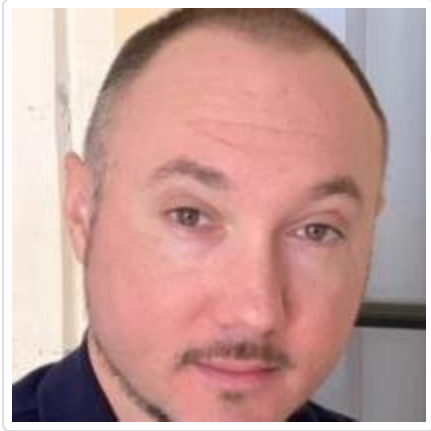




John G. Pappas
